FOCUS on active fixed income management

The Carillon Reams Core Bond Fund is actively managed by a team of institutional class fixed income specialists from Reams Asset Management, an affiliate of Carillon Tower Advisers. The fund's investment team:



Reacts to market opportunities instead of trying to predict market movements.



Focuses primarily on high-guality investment-grade U.S. dollar-denominated securities.



Defines risk as permanent loss of principal or the inability to meet investment objectives, not volatility or tracking error versus a benchmark.




Aims to maximize total return and preserve capital using more sectors of the fixed income market.



CONSIDER core as a portfolio anchor

The Carillon Reams Core Bond Fund is a true core product that does not invest heavily outside its benchmark index. With its active approach, the Fund doesn't merely track the index - its managers focus on undervalued issues in the fixed income market to seek attractive opportunities, even during times of market volatility.

A core fund can potentially play a stabilizing role in an investor's portfolio, serving as ballast in relation to higher risk investments. As illustrated in the chart below, the actively managed Core Bond Fund (Class I shares) has provided steady growth of capital over the past 10 years.

PRINCIPLES contribute to performance

The investment team's distinctive, steadfast principles have resulted in competitive long-term performance versus peers.

- Risk Definition and Management: The team defines risk as a permanent loss of principal or the inability to meet investment objectives, and manages it through stress tests and scenario analysis.
- Total Return Focus: The Fund focuses on long-term value and total return over a full cycle rather than only looking at income/yield.
- Flexible and Nimble Approach: The combination of Reams' size and its active opportunistic approach allows the team to adjust the portfolio guickly to capture mispricing in the marketplace.
